GUIDELINES FOR THE SHORT ABSTRACT SUBMISSION

All abstracts must be submitted via online form that is accessible from the Congress website:
www.peatlandcongress2021.com

THE SHORT ABSTRACT FORMAT

Language: English

Title of the abstract: In UPPERCASE letters, maximum 20 words

Abstract authors: Full names of the author(s), affiliations (including countries)

Presenting author: Full names of the author, affiliations (including country)

Contact information: E-mail of the presenting author

Main text of the abstract: maximum 300 words, introduce topic, describe methods, main results and conclusions in plain writing. No figures or tables.

NB! Please double-check the information before submitting the abstract - especially the grammar and the names and affiliations of author(s), as the content will be published in the Congress proceedings as submitted.

If your abstract contains formulae, please send the file as a Word document to ipc2021@publicon.ee as well (in case the formatting of the formulae gets distorted in the submission form). This is only applicable if your abstract contains formulae as the abstract form might show certain symbols (e.g. square or cube roots) incorrectly, but these will show up correctly in the actual abstract.

In the abstract submission form, authors are requested to choose the Topic/subtopic under which the contribution should appear. Please note that the sub-themes are preliminary and may be subject to change.

- Submitting the same abstract under more than one topic is not allowed. Duplicates identified by the Scientific Committee will be rejected.
- The Scientific Committee has the right to suggest transferring the submitted abstract under another topic.
- If your submission does not fit the sub-topics under the given categories, select V.5 – Other forms of peatland use. The Scientific Committee will endeavour to allocate the abstracts according to authors' preferences but reserves the right to amend the final list of topics and accordingly reallocate the submitted abstracts.

The submission of an abstract carries with it the obligation that it is actually presented at the Congress by the author or, at least, by one of the co-authors. As the Congress is taking place in hybrid format, oral presentations can be also made online. When the abstract is accepted by the Scientific Committee, at least the presenting author must have a valid registration for the Congress by 31 March 2021.

An abstract has been submitted successfully and has been received if the author receives an automatically generated email confirmation.

By submitting an abstract, the authors certify that they have read and agree to the following terms:

- The authors are authorized by their co-authors to enter into these arrangements.
- The work does not contain content that is unlawful, abusive or constitutes a breach of contract or of confidence or of commitment given to secrecy.

By submitting the abstract the authors are asked to agree or decline to publish the abstract in the Congress abstract book and on the IPS website. Authors retain the copyright of the abstract.
